# Religious Studies minor program guidelines

### Required for graduation

No

#### Credit hours required

A minimum of 15 credit hrs. 1000 level courses shall not be counted in the minor.

#### Transfer and EM credit hours allowed

A student is permitted to count up to 6 total hours of transfer credit and/or credit by examination.

## Overlap with the GE

A student is permitted to overlap up to 6 credit hours between the GE and the minor.

## Overlap with the major and additional minor(s)

- The minor must be in a different subject than the major.
- The minor must contain a minimum of 12 hours distinct from the major and/or additional minor(s).

#### Grades required

- Minimum C- for a course to be listed on the minor.
- Minimum 2.00 cumulative point-hour ratio required for the minor.
- Course work graded Pass/Non-Pass cannot count on the minor.
- No more than 3 credit hours of coursework graded Satisfactory/Unsatisfactory may count toward the minor.

#### X193 credits

No more than 3 credit hours.

# Approval required

The minor program must be approved by the academic unit offering the minor.

#### Filing the minor program form

The minor program form must be filed at least by the time the graduation application is submitted to a college/school counselor.

### Changing the minor

Once the minor program is filed in the college office, any changes must be approved by:
